# **GET ANIMATED**

## A century of Disney

'We love being a part of that Disney heritage,' says John Lasseter, the director of 'Toy Story' and creative mastermind of Pixar Studios, 'Pete Docter I director of "Monsters, Inc" and I are both doing what we do because of Walt Disney's work. He took this noveltyanimation, which was considered a pennyarcade entertainment - and saw the art that could be in it. So when he was doing "Snow White and the Seven Dwarfs", there were people all around telling him there was no way someone would sit through an animated cartoon that's an hour and a half long - "Disney's folly", they called it. But Walt trained these artists and raised the quality of his films to an incredible level. And it was the Number One movie in 1938, changing the industry. There are strong parallels between "Toy Story" and "Snow White", both the first of their kind. We had people saving the same thing about computer animation, that audiences wouldn't watch a feature's worth of it. They didn't look beyond to the potential it had.' Nick Bradshaw
